

Protect 340B for your hospitals and communities.

Four reasons why the New York State Legislature should pass the *340B Prescription Drug Anti-Discrimination Act* to preserve 340B:

Right now, major drug manufacturers and other entities are unilaterally dismantling the 340B Drug Discount Pricing Program, weakening our safety net healthcare providers and jeopardizing New Yorkers' access to care.

What is 340B?

- The 340B Drug Pricing Program is a federal program created by Congress in 1992.
- Drug manufacturers that participate in Medicare and Medicaid are required to provide discounted outpatient medications to eligible 340B hospitals and other healthcare providers.
- These hospitals and providers use the savings from discounted drug purchases to sustain operations and invest in patient care services.

1 It protects patient access to care at your hospitals and clinics. Supporting S.1913/A.6222 helps protect critical 340B drug discounts from drug manufacturers for more than 100 hospitals and other healthcare providers throughout New York state. The savings generated through 340B are essential to the financial stability of these providers and allow them to enhance, expand and safeguard healthcare services for your communities.

2 It curbs abusive practices by drug manufacturers, pharmacy benefit managers and other for-profit entities. These companies are increasing their profits by diverting 340B drug savings away from not-for-profit hospitals and other providers through unilateral, discriminatory and burdensome actions. Supporting S.1913/A.6222 stops these actions and ensures that the financial benefits of the 340B program stay where they were intended — in your community supporting patient care, instead of padding the profits of national corporations.

3 It protects New York's Medicaid program and state budget. 340B drug discounts are provided directly by billion-dollar drug manufacturers and represent only a small share of pharmaceutical industry revenue. When these savings are eroded, hospitals and other providers are forced to turn to state government to make up the shortfall. Supporting S.1913 /A.6222 helps preserve the financial stability and service capacity of 340B providers — avoiding a cost shift to New York's Medicaid program or state budget.

4 It aligns New York with other states that have already acted. Supporting S.1913/A.6222 would place New York alongside more than 20 other states that have acted to stop for-profit drug manufacturers and others from circumventing 340B requirements to increase their profits at the expense of patient care in your community.

Washington cannot be relied on to protect 340B. With the new financial risks of H.R. 1, 340B is one of the strongest tools left to protect New York's safety net hospitals and preserve New Yorkers' access to care.


