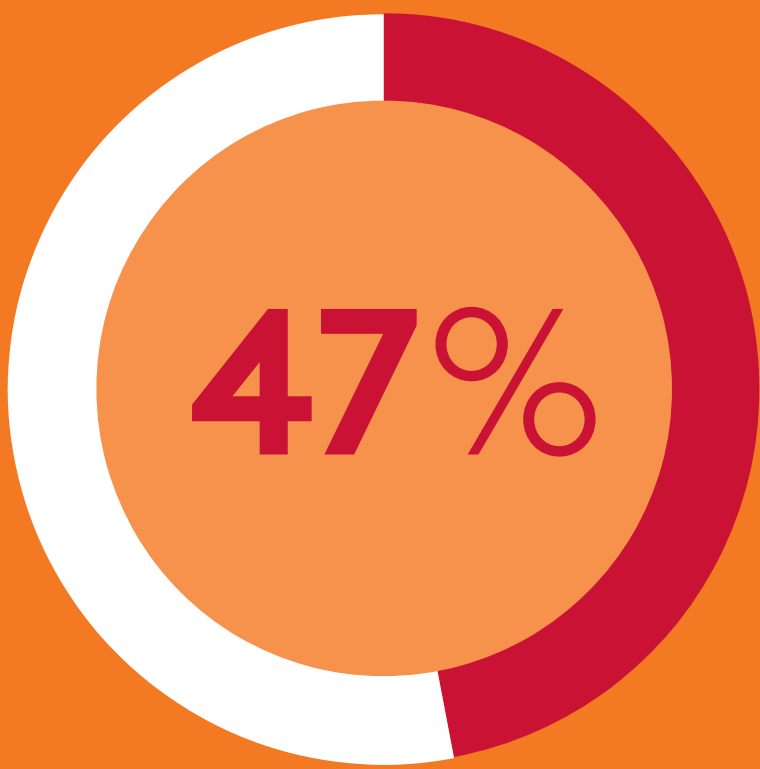

A Powerful Partnership

The **SAMUEL CURTIS JOHNSON GRADUATE SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT**, a school within the Cornell SC Johnson College of Business at Cornell University, delivers business education that empowers students to turn ambition into impact. Program Curriculum

This 60-credit dual-degree program helps healthcare leaders develop and strengthen their business skills and management capabilities while deepening their understanding of key drivers in the industry.

LOCKSTEP REQUIRED COURSES

The program is structured in a lockstep cohort format, with most credits earned from courses required for both the program's MBA and MS degrees. MBA courses include marketing, financial accounting, microeconomics, business strategy, and operations management, while MS courses include health policy and economics, healthcare leadership, health informatics, data and technology, and healthcare negotiations.

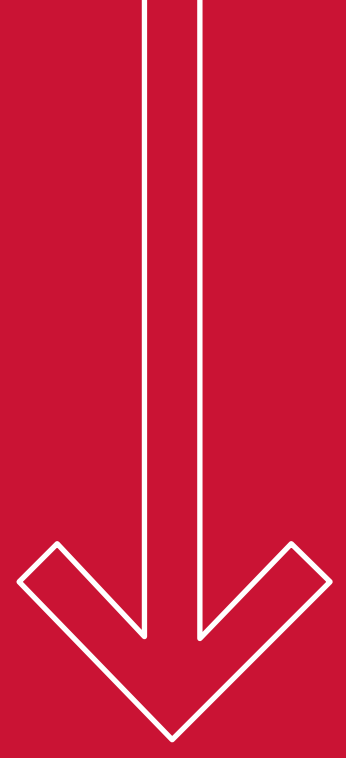
ELECTIVES

Elective courses allow students to customize their academic experience by diving deeper into specific areas of business and healthcare. Elective courses address a range of subjects including new venture management, entrepreneurship in life sciences, digital innovations in healthcare, design thinking, management communication, mergers and acquisitions, healthcare quality, and patient safety metrics.

CAPSTONE: HEALTHCARE IN PRACTICE

The design of the Capstone course gives students the opportunity to apply business acumen and a deeper knowledge of the healthcare industry to address challenges and opportunities faced by real-world industry partners. Students work in teams with client partners on a project during their final year of the program.

A guest speaker series that features senior industry leaders who share their perspectives on cutting-edge issues related to the rapidly evolving healthcare industry

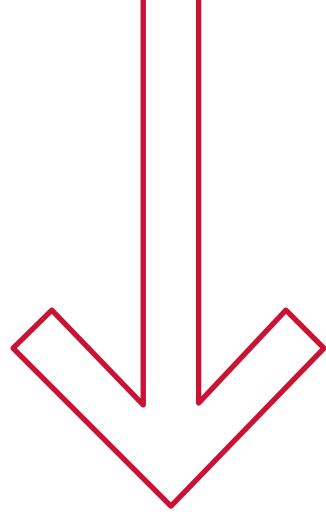

Career Development Office

LEADERSHIP COACHING

A required component of the program that is integrated into the Healthcare Leadership course, which includes a 360-assessment and one-on-one coaching sessions

CAREER COACHING

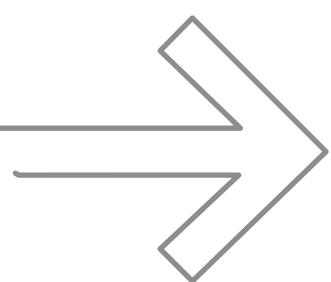
Strategic coaching on developing a career plan and tactical coaching throughout the search process, from writing a resume to negotiating an offer

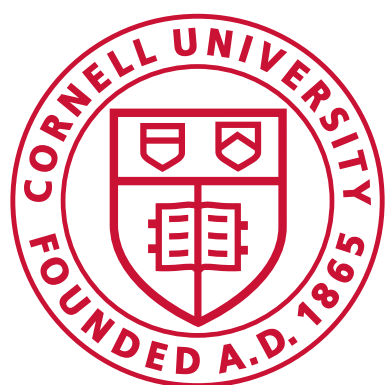
