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Addressing LGBTQ+ mental health needs

For decades, the LGBTQ+ community has faced issues of bias, discrimination and harassment, contributing to high rates of anxiety and depression.

Discrimination affects the **mental and economic wellbeing of 1 in 2 LGBTQ+ Americans**, who report moderate or significant negative psychological impacts.

In a survey of 1,528 LGBTQ+ adults, 29% said that discrimination had a major impact on their financial wellbeing – including 37% of Black respondents and 54% of transgender respondents.

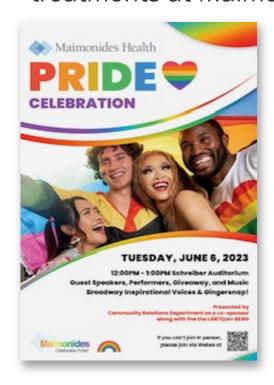




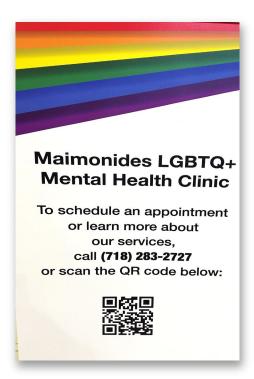


Promoting LGBTQ+ young adults' mental health in Brooklyn

How we chose our community partners (continued)

Performance Outcomes of Rainbow Heights Club:

83% of our members stay out of the hospital and in the community.

84% of members have visited their psychiatrist in the past month.

have visited their therapist in the past month.

of members have remained sober in the past year.

79% of members reported experiencing fewer symptoms of mental illness since joining.

Mental Health Services:

- Comprehensive psychosocial intakes;
- Psychiatric evaluation;
- Psychotherapy (individual and group, parent support);
- Psychiatric care, including medication management;
- Psychological testing when indicated;
- Referrals, collaboration with other clinical services:
 - Gender affirming care,
 - HIV treatment at Maimonides' Life Forward Clinic,
 - Collaboration with local LGBTQ+ services including community support organizations

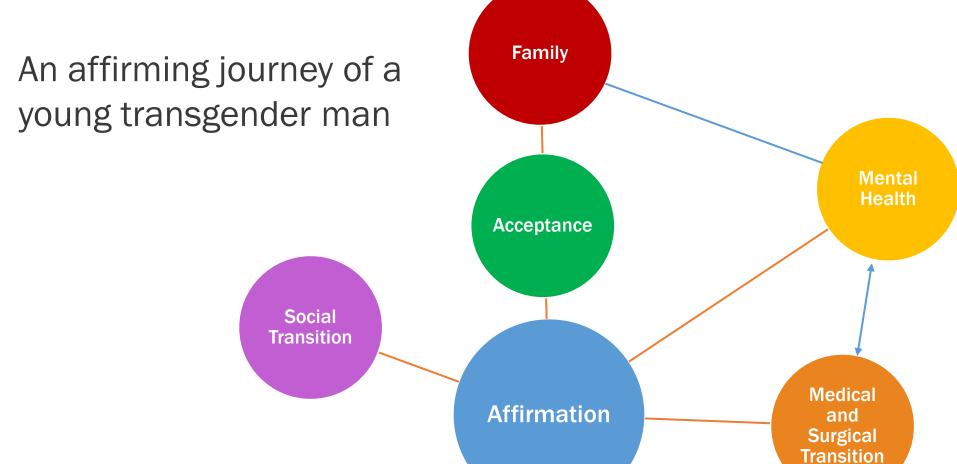

Challenges

- Trust from the community: the target population has historically been sidelined and has encountered discrimination, stigma and judgement in health care settings. Winning their trust takes time and perseverance.
- Staff training: through planning the project, it has become apparent that Maimonides Medical Center employees need frequent and consistent training to understand and appropriately serve this marginalized community.





What's next?

- Trans 101 Training will be provided by Rainbow Heights Club in 2024 for best practice in transgender care. Frequent refresher workshops will also be provided.
- 2. Search for more community partners with similar missions to ours.
- Improve digital presence and social media strategy to help establish Maimonides as a safe, affirming space.
- 4. Develop a comprehensive list of community resources to further serve the LGBTQ+ community.
