What we all know

- Complex patients arrive at hospitals for emergency care or when there are no alternatives
- The complexity and needs of patients has been increasing making it more difficult to identify safe discharge options
- The established systems of care are not nimble
- Payment mechanisms do not accommodate complex patients



What are we doing

- Regular bi-weekly meetings with other state agencies to examine systemic issues related to the gaps in the continuum of care for individuals with complex needs
- Assessing the various workgroups across agencies to assess overlap and duplication
- Interagency Resolution Unit (for Children and Youth)
- Roll out of a combined comprehensive children's waiver.
 - ARPA investments to enhance access to HCBS/CFTSS Workforce & Infrastructure Money to be disbursed
 - Providers delivering Children's HCBS, CFTSS and/or 29-I services funding for workforce and infrastructure investments IMD Advisory Group
- Statewide transformation Grants

- Expand community-based services to ensure a full continuum of home and community-based, crisis and short-term services
- Leverage federal flexibilities to expand access to services necessary to meet social care needs
