 - Intensive Care Unit (5 beds)
 - Women's Health & Maternity (5 beds)
 - Medical/Surgical Services, including Ambulatory Surgery (38 beds)
 - Pediatric (2 beds)
 - Psychiatric/Behavioral Health (12 beds)
- Our Skilled Nursing Facility & Inpatient Rehabilitation Center has 138 beds.

Age-Friendly Journey

- Age-Friendly participant in December of 2019
- We updated our EHR to include the 4M's in the fall of 2019 by adding
 - What Matters to admission questions & care plans
 - High-risk medications to fall assessment
 - NuDESC / CAM ICU delirium screening every 12 hours
 - TUG assessment on admission for fall risk





Age-Friendly Journey

- RN admission assessment creates consult request for PT, OT, RX & Dietary as needs are identified
- Patients are OOB for all meals
- Staff are receiving education about being Age Friendly and ways to provide excellent patient care to our geriatric patients
- We've had great staff participation!









Challenges

- Rural Community
 - Lack of providers in the area, specifically specialists in geriatrics
 - Less resources available
- COVID-19
 - Decrease in mobility r/t isolation precautions
 - Increased Hypoxia causing delirium = falls
 - Increased weakness of patients
- EHR
 - CPSI (Evident) hard to share information between disciplines





Age-Friendly Future Goals

- Currently, we are developing a medication review with our pharmacists to identify high-risk medications to bring to our hospitalist group providers.
- Increasing PT referrals for post-hospitalization PT.
- Working more with the Office of the Aging to coordinate care for our high-risk patients.
- Expanding our program to our clinics in the community.
